Rules for Index Mark for the Merit List:

Aggregate means total marks of the best four subjects (at least 100 marks paper). However, marks in compulsory Environmental Education /Studies shall not be taken into account for calculation of aggregate marks. If the subject "Environmental Science" is studied as an elective subject of 100 marks, may be taken into account for the purpose determining the aggregate marks.

Admission will be conducted on the basis of provisional merit list. Provisional Merit list has been generated on the basis of **Index Mark** (formula given on the list below).

For admission a SC/ST candidate must secure not less than 25% and an OBC candidate must secure not less than 10% of index mark of the last admitted candidate in General Category in Honours Courses.

*** No candidate shall be allowed admission under CBCS after appearing in examination under 1+1+1 system under University of Calcutta.

**** Students under CBCS system can take admission but they have to produce registration certificate and TC.
